

## VASCULAR REFERRALS TO QMH SIDCUP

TREAT IN COMMUNITY	No Vascular Referral Required Manage in the community	Varicose veins not meeting criteria for intervention Asymptomatic peripheral vascular disease	*For diabetic foot referrals please also see the footcare pathway*
OUTPATIENT REFERRALS	Routine Vascular Opinion Stable patient Refer routinely to clinic at Queen Mary Hospital, Sidcup	Symptomatic varicose veins Asymptomatic carotid stenosis Claudication Leg ulcers (non-arterial/ non-diabetic) Asymptomatic small aortic aneurysm (<5cm)	Refer as routine on ERS
URGENT REFERRALS	Urgent Vascular Opinion Stable patient requiring review within 2 weeks Refer urgently to clinic at Queen Mary Hospital, Sidcup	Chronic limb ischaemia (rest pain, night pain) Asymptomatic abdominal aortic aneurysm (5- 6cm)	Refer as urgent on ERS to arterial clinic

<u>EMERGENCY</u>

#### **Urgent Vascular Review**

Stable patient requiring review same week

Refer to the St Thomas' Hospital One-Stop Emergency Vascular Clinic (EVC)

### Critical limb ischaemia (gangrene or rest pain, no sepsis)

Acute iliofemoral DVT

Digital ischaemia

Asymptomatic large aneurysm (>6cm)

Emergency Vascular Admission Life or limb threatening emergencies Immediate transfer to St

Thomas' Hospital Emergency Department

#### Acute limb ischaemia Aortic dissection Ruptured or symptomatic aortic aneurysm Severe signs of sepsis related to critical limb ischaemia Severe diabetic foot infection / gas gangrene Critically unwell patient
